



How it Works!

You will need:

- An A4 picture of an item you like
- Piece of paper
- Black cardboard
- Pencils, pens and textas
- Glue/tape

How to do it:

Step 1. Pick a picture of an item or several items in one picture/image and print it out smaller than A4

Step 2. Fold the image in half

Step 3. Stick the folded image onto a piece of paper

Step 4. Draw the image opposite onto the blank side of the paper like a mirror image

Variations:

- Colour with one tone
- Use different mediums to draw the picture
- Incorporate charcoal and acrylic paint
- Make image into a stencil
- Stain-glass the image
- Theme the pictures for the whole class
- Draw the mirror image using abstract features - pieces of fruit, geometric shapes, all circles, different textures etc.



Investigate the expert...



This style of art was influenced by Ed Ruscha, an American artist known for his 'Back of Hollywood' art work done in 1976-1977. He was born on 16 December 1937 and is inspired by the Pop Art movement.

Ruscha had designed this art work to be viewed through the rear view mirror of a car.
